# NOTES FROM THE ANNUAL MEETING

If you attended the annual homeowner's meeting in January, you are aware that our bylaws, pool rules and architectural guidelines have been updated and amended. These are finalized and the updated versions are posted online for your reference. As a reminder, and for those who did not attend, we recommend accessing these documents online so you are familiar with these changes. It is the responsibility of each homeowner to be aware of the most current rules for the community. Important reminders and changes:

# ARCHITECTURAL GUIDELINES:

- OVERNIGHT STREET PARKING IS PROHIBITED.
- ANY MODIFICATION TO YOUR PROPERTY THAT IS NOT SPECIFICALLY ADDRESSED IN THE GUIDELINES, BYLAWS OR COVENANTS MUST BE APPROVED.
- METAL SHEDS ARE PROHIBITED; SHEDS ARE LIMITED TO 12WX16LX10H.

VIOLATIONS OF THE DFWCHOA ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE GUIDELINES WILL BE ADDRESSED IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

- 1<sup>ST</sup> NOTICE GIVEN, NO FINE ASSESSED;
- 2<sup>ND</sup> NOTICE GIVEN, NO FINE ASSESSED;
- 3<sup>RD</sup> NOTICE GIVEN WILL ACCRUE A \$75 FINE AFTER WHICH THE HOMEOWNER WILL HAVE 30 DAYS TO MAKE CORRECTIONS.
  - THE HOMEOWNER TAKES CORRECTIVE ACTION = NO FURTHER FINES ASSESSED.
  - THE HOMEOWNER FILES A PLAN OF ACTION WITH A REASONABLE AND AGREED UPON TIMELINE FOR CORRECTIVE ACTION = NO FURTHER FINES ASSESSED.
  - THE HOMEOWNER FILES A PLAN OF ACTION WITH A TIMELINE BUT DOES NOT COMPLETE CORRECTIVE ACTION IN TIME FRAME STATED = FINES ASSESSED (RETROACTIVELY IF APPROPRIATE) FOR EACH MONTH FOLLOWING INITIAL 30 DAYS AFTER 3<sup>RD</sup> NOTICE.
  - THE HOMEOWNER DOES NOTHING = \$75 FINE ASSESSED EACH MONTH AFTER 30-DAY PERIOD FOLLOWING 3<sup>RD</sup> NOTICE.
  - FINES ARE DUE WITHIN 15 DAYS TO THE DFWCHOA TREASURER. FAILURE TO PAY FINES MAY RESULT IN ACTIONS DESCRIBED IN THE ENFORCEMENT SECTION OF THESE GUIDELINES.

# POOL RULES

- THE COMMITTEE NO LONGER REQUIRES A SIGNED WAIVER EACH SEASON, HOWEVER, PROPERTY OWNER'S ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWING AND ABIDING BY THE RULES OR KEY CARDS WILL BE DEACTIVATED.
- POOL PARTIES MAY BE SCHEDULED ANY DAY OF THE WEEK WITH THE EXCEPTION OF HOLIDAYS. PLEASE SEE WEBSITE FOR THE FORMS NECESSARY TO SCHEDULE.

# **BYLAWS**

UNPAID DUES AND ASSESSMENTS WILL ACCRUE A \$30/MONTH LATE FEE FOR EACH MONTH THEIR DUES GO UNPAID. LEINS WILL BE FILED REGULARLY ON PROPERTIES THAT HAVE MAINTAINED UNPAID DUES.

"WHILE THE HOA WILL MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO CONTACT THE HOMEOWNER IN VIOLATION DIRECTLY, IT REMAINS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH RESIDENT TO KNOW AND ABIDE BY THESE BYLAWS, COVENANTS AND GUIDELINES WITHOUT REMINDERS FROM THE ASSOCIATION. INACTION MAY RESULT IN THE BOARD CHOOSING TO CONTRACT OUT THE NECESSARY CORRECTIONS AND ASSESS THE COST TO THE VIOLATING HOMEOWNER."

# **Creating a Beautiful Green Lawn**

#### FERTILIZING

Begin fertilizing in spring for a healthy lawn this year. First application should be in early April for Central Oklahoma. Repeat every 4-8 weeks during the growing season. The growing season for Bermuda lawns is April thru August, while for fescue lawns it is March thru May and September thru October. Do not fertilize fescue lawns during the hot months of June thru August. Use a complete fertilizer with an analysis of 21-3-7 with 4% iron and 13% sulfur.

#### PRE-EMERGENT WEED CONTROL

Pre-emergent weed control is the most effective way to have a weed-free lawn. Pre-emergent herbicides control weeds by forming a barrier that prevents the seed from germinating. Pre emergent becomes more effective with each application. We recommend two pre-emergent treatments each year to prevent both broadleaf and grassy weeds in existing lawns. Apply between February 1 and March 15 to control spring weeds. Make a second application between August 15 and September 15 to control fall weeds. Do not apply pre-emergent herbicides to newly planted lawns or if you plan to overseed. Always water the lawn very well after applying pre-emergent.

#### POST-EMERGENT WEED CONTROL

Post-emergent weed control kills weeds that are visible, but does not prevent weed seed from germinating.

#### **INSECT CONTROL**

Many kinds of insects or insect-like pests harbor in lawns. Most are more of a nuisance rather than actually causing serious damage to lawns. Occasionally, populations of grubs, armyworms, sod webworms, aphids, leafhoppers, and pillbugs become large enough to require control. If you have noticed a lot of beetles around your trees and shrubs during June, chances are that your lawn has grubs. Grubs are the larvae stage of Japanese beetles. It is important to control grubs at this early stage — they will do the most damage to your lawn now by feeding upon your lawn's root systems and killing it. <u>All insecticide products should be watered in after application</u>.

#### WATERING YOUR LAWN

Watering is one of the most often misunderstood aspects of turf grass culture. Often, watering on turf areas is too frequent and too light. Frequent, shallow watering encourages shallow rooting, soil compaction, thatch accumulation, and weed seed germination. Ideally, turf should not be irrigated on a regular schedule but on one that is determined by need. An irrigation program cannot be developed to fit every location due to:

- 1. Dissimilar water holding capacities of different soil types.
- 2. Weekly fluctuations in temperature, humidity, wind, and precipitation.
- 3. The influence of management practices, such as mowing and fertilization on turf grass water consumption.

Sandy coarse-textured soils absorb water faster but retain less water than fine-textured soils like loams and clays. Thus, it takes less water to moisten sandy soil to a 6-inch depth than to moisten a clay soil to the same depth. This means more frequent applications of less water are required for turf grasses growing on sandy soils.

The ideal time to water is when turf grasses show the first visual symptoms of water need or wilt, characterized by "foot printing" and a blue-gray appearance. When turf grasses experience moisture stress, their leaves begin to roll or fold and wilt. Enough water should be applied in one application to wet the soil to a 6-inch depth. This can be checked by probing the soil. After watering a few times you should develop a feel for the amount of time and water required for deep watering. If the area begins to puddle and run-off is occurring, stop irrigating and allow the water to soak into the soil.

Early morning is an ideal time to irrigate. New seed, sod, and plugs require frequent light watering. Established lawns need less frequent but deep watering to develop deep root systems. Including rainfall, these minimum amounts promote the best growth and make management of your lawn easier.

- Spring & Fall 1 inch per week
- Summer 2 inches per week
- ✤ Winter 1/2 inch per week
